# Introduction

- The Animal **Identification Act No. 6 of 2002**, states that it is by law that all livestock in South Africa must to be marked.
- Each cattle owner must apply for the registration of an identification mark from the Registrar of Animal Identification.
- Purchased animals must be branded within 14 days after he/she becomes the owner of the animal.

# Introduction

- Livestock are marked using assorted identification marks:  
(ear tags, branding, tattooing and ear notching)
- They are marked in different ways for various reasons which include:
  1. For identifying one animal from the other
  2. To prove ownership
  3. For recording purpose



# Why keep records?




- Used as a management tool
- Records help evaluate herd inventory, maintain biosecurity and track performance of animals in the herd
- Help in decision making and planning: Selection and sales



# What records to keep?



- Production: Number of calves born, Birth weights, Weaning weights, Mortality rates, Fertility test, PD's, *etc*
- Financial: Purchases and sales, loans and accounts



**Income – Expenses = PROFIT**

# Importance of record keeping

- Improves time and resource management
- Improve farm profitability
- Sustain the farm for future generations



## ***When recording***

- ✓ *Make sure you record the correct measurement*
  - ✓ *Scale is calibrated at all times.*
- ✓ *Correct sex and birth weight of a calf is of utmost importance.*
  - ✓ *Cows sometimes swop calves.*



# Important records




Calve Records	Cow records
Birth date	Calving dates
Birth mass/weight <b>Within 3 days of birth</b>	Pregnancy tests results
Dam and sire ID's	Calving status
Weaning mass & date	Weaning mass
Sex of calve	ICP

- Mating dates
- Vaccinations
- Purchases and/sales
- Mortalities
